CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (Please read carefully)

- This training day is an opportunity for you to ride your test, speak with the judge and then ride the test again.
- Test sheets will be given to you after each test.
- There will be no scoring or ribbons provided at this event.
- Riders are limited to one test (ridden twice) per horse at this event.
- Events will be held in accordance with current EA Dressage Rules as amended except where FEI Rules apply. The NCEC Inc committee may grant exemptions to the rules for special promotional competitions. **The onus is on competitors to know the rules.**
- **The conditions below are relevant for competitions/events held by NCEC Inc.**
- **Entry fees** may be paid by credit card to Global Entries on Line or by internet banking. If you choose to use this option the receipt **MUST** be sent to the club at PO Box 3458, Weston Creek ACT 2611 or via email to ncecontact@gmail.com to be accepted. Enter the riders name and competition date as the reference, eg LPugh12Feb06. - **Refunds** After the close of entries the club will refund 50% of entry fees when presented with a veterinary or medical certificate within 48 hours of the competition. The compulsory Admin fee is not refundable.
- Scratching before close of entries the full entry fee will be refunded. **Scratchings** will be accepted up to and including the day of competition.
- **EA Registration** and performance cards must be available on the day of competition (official events).
- **Height of horses and ponies:** Refer current 2011 EA Dressage Rules.
- **Stallions;** Effective as of 01 January 2011, The horse (stallion) & Float must display Stallion Identification Discs at all times. Discs are available for purchase from the National Office of equestrian Australia. Stallions are to be handled as in EA guidelines.
- Only horses that are entered for a competition are permitted on the grounds during the event.

- **Riders** may be changed before the start of competition – notification must be in writing at least 40 minutes prior to the start of that competition. A rider of a horse may not be changed if another rider has ridden the horse on the day, either in warm-up or in a competition. One rider per horse for the whole event.
- Draw position cannot be changed without the permission of the Organising Committee.
- A competitor may not add a horse to the draw without approval of the Organising Committee
- **Conditions for Riding Attire & Hats.** As per EA Rules or special conditions as covered in the Competition schedule. Riders under 18 must wear an approved safety helmet at all times. Riders training other than warming up for a test must wear an approved safety helmet at all times.
- **Gear Check** – all competitors must present to the Gear Steward. Failure to do so may incur elimination.
- **Warm-up** please use designated warm-up areas, be aware of group riding rules, look where you are going, keep at least 10m from competition arenas
- **Riders** will not be permitted to ride if entry fees have not been received by the Organising Committee.
- **Callers** are allowed in all tests.
- **DNAs** please show the courtesy of scratching before the day if you are unable to attend the event.
- **Random swabbing** may take place. If approached by Official Steward / Vet Officer of the day, competitors must allow samples to be taken from their horse for drug tests.
- **Welfare of the horse is paramount.**
- Refer to current EA Dressage competition rules.
- **Risk Warning and Disclaimer**
